At the **Deer Valley Petroglyph Preserve**, we will explore southwest archeology, rock art, and the prehistoric cultures of Arizona who left their marks here between 500 and 7,000 years ago.

You are encouraged to think more deeply about history, social studies, cultural diversity, art, desert ecology and geology. The Preserve is the gateway to Arizona's rich archaeological past, and serves to connect the past to the present. Using the over 1600 petroglyphs, you will learn that rock art is a window to the world of ancient peoples and that there are multiple interpretations for thinking about rock art meaning.
